INDEPENDENT AUDITORS' REPORT

To the Members of Muizenberg Improvement District NPC

Opinion

We have audited the annual financial statements of the company set out on pages 4 to 10, which comprise the statement of financial position as at 30 June 2021, statement of comprehensive income and statement of cash flows for the year then ended, and notes to the annual financial statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies.

In our opinion, the annual financial statements present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of the company as at 30 June 2021, and its financial performance and cash flows for the year then ended in accordance with the International Financial Reporting Standard for Small and Medium-sized Entities and the requirements of the Companies Act of South Africa.
