- Costa Da Gama seems like it was built at a similar time.

















SAPS & Neighbourhood Watch


SAPS Muizenberg has 3 different sectors. Each sector has a sector commander.

The community can and should be involved with SAPS through the NHWs and through the CPF.



There is a **Muizenberg Lakeside Residents Association (MLRA)** – it is entirely donation and volunteer driven.


In Vrygrond & Capricorn, there are a number of organisations.

Political Boundaries

Cape Town is **divided into 116 areas,** called wards.

Wards are groups of **neighbouring suburbs** that are managed together, which allow the City to manage service delivery successfully for all residents.
